



THEATER 101

How much do you know about theater? Each newsletter issue will provide information about the technical and behind the scenes aspects of the theater arts.

WCT has had many productions in which a battle ensues between indviduals or groups. These fight scenes have had the combatants using weapons, such as sticks or swords. In order to have these fights look realistic and safe, there is a lot of planning that is involved. First, the type of weapon needs to be determined. The tools must be sturdy so they do not break on contact. Special stage weaponry, which look realistic without being sharp, is used. Next, the fight scene is choreographed. Each actor has a numbered and choreographed series of attacks.

They learn these moves based on a set of quadrants around the frame of their body. At first, the focus is on partner work and learning the movements. Once that is mastered, we work on perfecting the placement on the stage, increasing the speed, and including dialogue that goes along with it. Each fight scene is practiced
